

SASC Fundraising & Volunteering Options September 2010- April 2011

To off-set skating fees, the St. Albert Skating Centre members participate in fundraising events. For the 2010-2011 season, each member will be required to work one bingo or competition shift (5 hour value) for each day of the week their skater is registered for the winter session. Or, you may make a contribution to our basket raffle table to the equivalent value of \$100.

Working bingos and hosting competitions are ways the club can keep skating fees as affordable as possible for all skaters. We rely on the generous commitment of time from all club members to volunteer to help us fundraise. This is also an excellent opportunity to meet other club members, which is useful in sharing information and building stronger connections.

All parents must write an undated, signed cheque for \$125 per day of the week their child is skating. Once the fundraising obligation has been met, each cheque will be ripped-up. If by the end of the skating season fundraising credits are still outstanding, the cheques will be cashed.

Members will also have the opportunity to work additional bingos or competition shifts, as available, after fulfilling commitments. Credits will be applied to the skater at \$60 per shift worked, that may only be applied to St. Albert Skating Centre related expenses (i.e. ice fees, registration fees, test day fees.)

To find which bingo dates are available, please visit the club website and click the "fundraising tab" on the left-hand side. To register for bingos, email sasc@telusplanet.net and request which bingo you would like to work.

Our upcoming "Funskate" competition will be held on December 3-5, 2010 and a volunteer schedule will be posted sometime in September. A full description of volunteer jobs are on the reverse of this sheet.

2010 SASC Funskate Competition- Volunteer Job Descriptions
1 credit = 5 hour shift

Ice Captain

- 1) Two Ice Captains per event are required – one to check in at the dressing room and one to put skaters on the ice. Ice Captains are responsible for checking coaches' accreditation.
**MUST BE OVER 16 YEARS OLD

Runners

- 1) One runner per event is required. (a team of two on each event works well if small children)
Reports will be taken to the Data Control room at the end of each warm up group.
- 2) Transfers the report, quickly, from the Data Specialists atrink side to the Data Control room.
**MUST BE OVER 12 YEARS OLD

Timer

- 1) One Timer per event is required to time length of programs. The referee will give instructions as to the length of the program and the point in time he/she wishes to be notified.
**MUST BE 14 YEARS OLD

Registration

- 1) Registers skaters and officials upon arrival for the competition.
- 2) Accept and sign in/sign out music and hand out name tags and treat bags.
**MUST BE 16 YEARS OLD

Set-up/ Take Down

- 1) Sets up venue requirements prior to Event (usually day before) e.g. officials stand, rink boards and banners, tables and chairs, etc.
- 2) Disassemble venue and pack equipment for transportation to the Section Office as required. Other duties as required.
**MUST BE 16 YEARS OLD

Accomodations and Hospitality

- 1) Set-up officials' room (at arena and hotel), volunteers' room, and coaches' room.
- 2) Assist in maintaining food levels and cleaning up in officials' room (at arena and hotel), volunteers' room, and coaches' room
**MUST BE 18 YEARS OLD

Medals and Ceremonies

- 1) Assisting with Opening Ceremonies and presenting medals & awards during the event
**MUST BE 12 YEARS OLD & ACCOMPANIED BY AN ADULT

Boutique

- 1) Sell tickets for S.A.S.C. raffles and fundraisers.
**MUST BE 12 YEARS OLD & ACCOMPANIED BY AN ADULT

Play Music & Announcing

- 1) Play music and announce skaters' names during practice ice. ** MUST BE 18 YEARS
